# Minutes of the meeting of High Power Committee (HPC) on RIDF/WIF held on 25.01.2017 at 05.30 p.m. at Conference Hall, NABANNA, 13th Floor

Persons present: As per the attendance sheet.

The High Power Committee (HPC) Meeting was held in the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, NABANNA and was chaired by Shri Basudeb Banerjee, Chief Secretary, Government of West Bengal. It was attended by the Departmental Secretaries undertaking RIDF/ Warehousing Infrastructure Fund (WIF) projects, CGM NABARD and other officials. The Chief Secretary started the discussion highlighting that the loan from NABARD is a cheaper source of fund and the departments must take the advantage of the loan for infrastructural development of the State. He stressed on improving the execution of RIDF/WIF schemes. He requested the CGM, NABARD to circulate the checklist and other guidelines for RIDF/WIF works to the Departments.

Shri H.K. Dwivedi, Principal Secretary, Finance Department briefed the house about the progress of RIDF XXII, projects submitted and sanctions received etc.

- The value of proposals submitted by Departments to NABARD under New Projects (Rs 1889.68 Crores) and Spill-over projects (Rs 1591.95 Crores) amounted to a total of
- Presently, sanctions for only Rs 1095.50 crore was conveyed by NABARD while Rs. 3481.63 Crores. proposals for Rs 418.88 crore were reported to be sent to Head Office of NABARD.
- Finance Department, Government of West Bengal, has released Rs 1762.21 Crores to line Departments, against which Rs 990.92 crores has been released.

The following discussions took place:

CGM NABARD stated that higher sanctions could not be accorded due to quality of proposals submitted by some departments and due to its sectoral limitations. However, these sanctions were made by September 2016. CGM NABARD stated that the NABARD Normative share for this year will not be enhanced over the given Rs 1300 Crores for West Bengal, as other states had also utilized their shares of normative allotment. He conveyed the following dates for the closure of various tranches:

RIDF XV - 31 December 2016 (exp. to be reimbursed upto 31 March 2017)

RIDF XVI-31 March 2017 (exp. to be reimbursed upto 30 June 2017)

RJDF XVII to XIX - 31 March 2017

- A few Departments mentioned that they were not able to execute projects, despite availability of funds under RIDF, due to non-sanction of projects by NABARD. This was leading to contraction of their Plan Budget expenditure, as a significant portion of their Plan Budget was against RIDF. They requested that NABARD should sanction projects of all line departments having Budget Provision/ HPC allocation. Alternatively, the funds sanctioned under Plan Budget, under RIDF, may be allotted in their Core Plan Budget by Finance Department.
- Secretary, Finance (Budget), mentioned that in the Rs 1350 Crores rupees sanctions conveyed by NABARD, initially Rs 483 Crores was for projects of a single department which had a Budget Provision, under RIDF, of Rs 45 Crores only and rest 25 departments having RJDF allocations were compressed in nearly 850 Crores. This sanction also did not have a concurrence of Finance Department. He requested that the HPC may finalize the allocations for next F.Y. so that the same may be incorporated in the Budget for FY 2017-18.

### Decisions taken:

1. NABARD should sanction and finalize the projects at the earliest by 3rd February 2017 from amongst the projects already submitted. Early sanction may be conveyed and NABARD will return unsanctioned projects to the respective Administrative Departments. The Administrative Departments will execute spillover projects from their respective allotment under core plan and such projects will not be included in further Tranches of RIDF.

2. For the FY 2017-18 onwards, the RIDF components of some departments may be accommodated within their core plan. This will reduce the delay in funds sanction and the smaller departments will not face contraction of their plan budget due to delayed sanction and execution. RIDF projects of Tranche XXII for such departments may be accommodated and executed from the funds already released vide order 500-F.B. dated 25.07.2016 of Finance Department. Critical projects, under RIDF, pending NABARD sanction, may also be undertaken from these funds. Unutilized funds available with the departments, released vide above order, are as follows:

If, it is seen, during F.Y. 2017-18, that the NABARD project sanctions are not sufficient for any department, as compared to budget provision, the balance share shall be provided by F.D. by suitable augmentation of Core Plan for such departments.

These Departments were requested to submit project proposals under RIDF-XXIII within their respective allocation directly to NABARD with intimation to Finance Department by 15th May, 2017.

All Departmental Heads were requested to complete the projects under RIDF-XV to 4. RIDF-XJX at the earliest.

## Action: Departmental Secretaries

Departments should regularly review Non-Starter Projects (NSPs) and Slow Moving 5. Projects (SMPs) and submit status report to NABARD and Finance Department periodically. The departments were requested to either drop the non-starter projects or taken them up immediately.

Concerned Departments have been requested to send detailed DPR, with duly filled check list, technical details, land availability and other relevant information to NABARD to get early sanction.

NABARD is also requested to take necessary action so that a pre-approved scheme bank may be created for next Financial Year 2017-18. This will enable departments to undertake projects in the pre-monsoon season also. Since in the present project approval cycle, the project sanction are received by July/August, but due to setting in of monsoon the project execution gets delayed.
